1115 SUD Waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services description

- IOP includes structured programming
- Treatment is focused on clinical issues
- A SUD assessment using the ASAM criteria determines a clinical diagnosis and recommendations for the intensity and setting of treatment needed (outpatient, intensive outpatient, or residential) and supportive services



1115 SUD Waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services service components

- Individualized assessment and treatment.
- Cognitive, behavioral, and other mental health **and** substance use disorder
- Treatment therapies (individual, group, family)
- Psychoeducational services
- Linkage to medication services
- Crisis Intervention Services
- Linkage to social support services



1115 SUD waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services contraindicated services

• Contraindicated Services are services that are <u>not allowed</u> to be provided to the same recipient on the same day as 1115 Waiver services. These are found listed in the manual, page 13.

1115 SUD waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services requirements/expectations

- 1. Be provided as a therapeutic outpatient program that maintains daily scheduled treatment activities; and
- 2. Provide the range of service components identified for intensive outpatient services in the manual.



Requirements/expectations cont.

- SUD programs must provide integrated either co-occurring capable or co-occurring enhanced services
- Establish and maintain a waiting list of persons seeking treatment who cannot be admitted utilizing a unique modifier for person who inject/use intravenous (IV).
- Persons actively or experiencing drug use by injection, who are requesting treatment, shall be admitted no later than 14 days after the request.
- If there is no slot available, it is recommended those using by injection, be provided with interim services within 48 hours and admitted no later than 120 days after the initial request.



If no slot is available, it is recommended

- SUD program provide clients with harm and risk reduction counseling.
- Interim services should be provided to individuals on the waitlist
- Can be provided by the program or another agency

- Adults 18 and older
- Individuals experiencing a mental disorder and significant functional impairment that interferes with their ability to participate in one or more life domains

1115 SUD waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services frequency/limits

Group IOP

Youth- Must receive 16 units per week at a minimum with a maximum of 304 units per State Fiscal Year (SFY)

Adults- Must receive 28 units per week at a minimum with a maximum of 304 units per SFY Individual IOP

Youth AND Adults must receive a **minimum of 4 units per week** with a maximum of 128 units per SFY

After the SFY limits of 128 are utilized, a service authorization request can be submitted for up to 128 units or a 90-day period.



1115 SUD waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services service documentation

Must be documented in a progress note in accordance with 7 AAC 135.130 Clinical record.



1115 SUD waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services relationship to other services

IOP services may be provided concurrently with any service listed in standards manual not otherwise contraindicated

Providers may administer pharmacological treatment in conjunction with outpatient substance use disorder treatment services in (a) of this section if the pharmacological treatment is provided by an individual listed in <u>7 AAC 135.010(b)(2)</u>.

1115 SUD waiver – ASAM Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services other important details

Programs may employ a multidisciplinary team of professionals to work in their IOP programs; however, clinical services must be provided by a Qualified Addictions Professional (QAP). Peer certification/designation alone does NOT meet minimum requirement.

BH intensive outpatient contraindicated services

Contraindicated Services are services that are <u>not allowed</u> to be provided to the same recipient on the same day as 1115 Waiver services.

- 1. Be provided as a therapeutic outpatient program that maintains daily scheduled treatment activities;
- Address clinical issues affecting recipient's ability to cope with activities of daily living defined in <u>7 AAC 139.250(2) Structured treatment services</u>, and
- Provide the range of service components identified for intensive outpatient services in the manual.




1115 BH waiver - Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services target population

Individuals experiencing a mental disorder, as defined under <u>7 AAC 139.010 Recipient eligibility</u> and significant functional impairment that interferes with their ability to participate in one or more life domains

See regulation: 7 AAC 135.055 Adult experiencing a serious mental illness


