

March 31 State Plan Amendment

- The Division commits to retaining short-term crisis services in the state plan.
- The Divisions does not change the provider types eligible to provide Screening and Brief Intervention Services.
- The Division revised the submission to reflect 30 hours instead of 10 hours service limitations for "any combination of individual, group, and family therapy."
